We celebrate World Breastfeeding Week every year during the first week of August. It commemorates the signing of the 1990 Innocenti Declaration by government policymakers, the WHO, UNICEF, and other global organizations in order to promote, protect, and support breastfeeding worldwide. This



celebration universally encourages breastfeeding and spreads awareness on how mother's milk improves the health of women and children around the world.

World Breastfeeding Week 2020 focuses on the impact of infant feeding on the environment and climate change and the importance of promoting, protecting, and supporting breast feeding for the health of the planet and its people. Breast milk is a natural renewable food source that is environmentally safe and

produced and delivered without pollution, packaging, or waste. While sometimes a medically required food, the formula industry has a greater negative impact on the environment as it requires electricity and water for production, generates waste products, and overall leaves a larger carbon footprint during the manufacturing process.

As society recognizes the importance of conservation, promoting and supporting breastfeeding is one of the simplest ways we can contribute to a healthier planet. Investment in breastfeeding medical education, improved antenatal breastfeeding instruction, better access to screened donor milk from regulated milk banks when supplementation is needed, and increased numbers of Board Certified Lactation Consultants are just some examples of how we can all support this global effort.

The Summit will once again be hosted by the Pediatric Hematology/Oncology division of the Children's Center of Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and Murtha Cancer Center on 24 September 2020 from 0800-1200. The summit has served as a platform for highlighting the supportive efforts that cross disciplines and collectively establish patient-centered quality care, highlighting topics such as OncoFertility, Survivorship, and Transitions of Care. This year, the event will highlight Integrative Medicine in Pediatrics and Oncology. Invited subjective matter experts in wellness, nutritional medicine, palliative care, behavioral health, and therapeutic supportive services from Johns Hopkins University Children's Center, New York Presbyterian, Georgetown University, and Walter Reed National Military Medicine, will provide insight into the most advanced practices for augmented outcomes in patient care, underscored by individual patient experiences. The conference is geared toward Pediatricians, Pediatric Subspecialists, Pediatric subspecialists, Behavioral Health Specialists, Psychosocial support providers, Palliative care experts, as well as other physicians, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, and registered nurses involved in any oncology care.
