Uniformed Services Chapter East is here to support our members interested in grant opportunities.





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Spotlight: 2020 Outstanding Young Pediatrician (OYP) Winners



COVID-19 has changed much of the way we collaborate and highlight our members. For 2020 we still were able to recognize three outstanding pediatricians for their contributions to childhood wellness and their military units.

Air Force: **Maj (Dr.) Alison Helfrich** – Currently stationed at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center where she serves as a Pediatric Infectious Disease Fellow.

Prior to her return to training she completed challenging OCONUS tours as a general pediatrician, where she served in various leadership positions while engaged in teaching our front-line medics. She has made notable contributions during each of her assignments, highlighting her skills as a pediatrician and a military officer.

Army: **MAJ** (**Dr.**) **Jennifer Falcon** – Currently stationed at Fort Belvoir Community Hospital where she serves as the Service Chief, Inpatient Pediatrics. Prior to her tenure at Fort Belvoir, MAJ Falcon supported the Department of Defense mission while deployed and as a Battalion Surgeon. She has demonstrated her versatility as a physician/military officer, and has continued to engage in teaching as well as research.

Navy: **LCDR (Dr.) Sarah Sturgill** – Currently stationed at Naval Medical Center Camp Lejeune where she serves as the Department Head of Pediatrics. She is a dedicated leader at the Navy's largest general pediatrics medical home, and only trauma center. In her career she has served overseas and participated in several leadership development opportunities. She also continues to engage in teaching and mentorship.

- Early childhood caries (cavities/ECC) = the number 1 chronic disease affecting young children
- ECC is 5 times more common than asthma and 7 times more common than hay fever
- Tooth pain keeps many children home from school or distracted from learning.
- AAP and ADA recommend children establish a dental home and have their first preventive dental visit by age 12 months for those at elevated risk of developing ECC

Despite these concerning statistics, many children and their families have trouble accessing oral health care, and even pediatricians may not know all the resources available

Establishing your dental referral network is essential to ensuring you aware of the resources available for the families you care for. Referral lists are made by canvassing your networks to see who accepts children of various ages with the TRICARE Dental Program or other dental insurance (i.e Medicaid), as appropriate, for your practice. Not all dentists will see young children (i.e. under the age of 3), so be sure and check out what's available in your area. One suggestion is checking for American Board of Pediatric Dentistry certified specialists in your area, and then cross referencing with those that take TRICARE.

Another good reason to know your local dentists is in the case of emergent referral needs for oral health: pronounced caries, acute infection, trauma, etc. Having that information handy for your patients can prove to be invaluable in a time of need.
